

Dear Church Family,

During our Charge Conferences this past year, we were told about the reorganization of our Districts into five regional areas, and also that this new organization would include some *rethinking* of how the local churches and the leadership of the Annual Conference might work together. Below you will find an edited version of the changes that are coming. The Bishop and Cabinet gathered in January to continue to do the redistricting work of reimagining the Indiana Conference of The United Methodist Church. During the Charge Conferences in 2024, the District Superintendents gathered responses from participants to inform them in this process. The Bishop and Cabinet took into careful consideration each response. They informed the decisions and work in relationship to the foundational values for the missional purpose of districts, the naming of the districts, and the formation of the district structure and leadership.

The local church is the most significant arena for disciple-making, and we are committed to equipping and resourcing the local church to increase their capacity for making disciples. The local church's mission field, the local church's mission, how a local church worships, and how a local church disciples will not change with the redistricting.

The values that were foundational in forming the new districts include: providing greater alignment of resources to the local church, creating systems to increase connection and collaboration, ensuring there will be intentional bidirectional communication, and having a more equitable balance of responsibilities for the superintendents.

NEW DISTRICT NAMES

Effective July 1, 2025, the new district names will be:

- 1. Southern Rivers District
- 2. West Central Plains District
- 3. Northern Lakes District
- 4. Eastern Rivers District

East Central Heights District

Plymouth First UMC will be in the Northern Lakes District, and we will return our current District Superintendent, Rev. Marti Lundy.



DISTRICT PURPOSE/STRUCTURE/STAFFING

Our working definition and purpose of the district is:

- An extension of our collective witness as the Indiana Conference,
- A connection between the local church and the resources of the Conference,
- To build and foster relationships,
- To support and resource clergy, lay leadership, and congregations,
- To encourage and cultivate "the call" of all persons,

To serve as a vehicle of mission.

The structure for each new district will have a District Missional Strategy Team (DMS Team), comprised of twelve (12) persons, which will include the District Lay Leader, the Superintendency Chairperson, the Church Building and Location Chairperson, and an Emerging Leader. This team replaces the former Operational Team and will operate similarly to the "one board model." This team will come alongside the district superintendent to provide district governance, engage ministry partnerships, provide connection within the district, care for and support of the district superintendent, and continue to foster the vision of the Indiana Conference and further the mission of The United Methodist Church. Each district will continue to have a District Committee on Ministry (dCOM), a Disaster Response Team, and United Women in Faith.

There will be great intention to recruit persons from across the district, with emphasis on inclusion and diversity. The paid staffing of the new districts will be served by no more than three, 1/4-time, Associate District Superintendents; and one District Administrative Assistant. There will be a process for discernment and these persons will be named in future updates.

OUR CONNECTION

The new districts will create a connecting system to provide opportunities for learning, nurturing, and connection. This ecosystem of connection will be called "Life Together." We will be ALL IN to do life together, share life together, and be the church together as we make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. More information about this new ecosystem will be forthcoming.

There are ongoing conversations and work being done to ensure better collaboration between the district and Conference programming. This will help to reduce redundancy, provide greater access, and make available relevant resources to the local church.

We are ALL IN and on the move, multiplying love, cultivating joy, and inspiring hope, as we live into this new year and in great anticipation of our shared "Life Together."

Report on Kitchen Remodeling

Clay's Flooring & Interiors, Inc. from Rochester began the Kitchen Remodeling on January 6. The project is anticipated to last 8 to 10 weeks. The Fellowship Hall will be used as a "staging area" so it will be closed to activities during that time.

Under-floor plumbing is complete; walls on the west and south have been framed; and the electric & plumbing have been roughed in. Drywall and new flooring are also complete. Plumbing fixtures and cabinetry are onsite.

The funds received from the 2019-2022 Rebuilding First Church Capital Campaign have been used to complete the following projects:

- ⇒ New light fixtures and ceiling fans in the sanctuary
- ⇒ Plaster repair of the cracks in the sanctuary
- ⇒ Repairs to walls of the Michigan Street entryway in the church due to previous water damage
- ⇒ Outside repairs on northwest side of the building
- \Rightarrow New LED sign
- ⇒ Replacement of 1 furnace in the church building
- ⇒ New stairs and railings, Michigan Street Entry
- \Rightarrow New carpet in the Sanctuary
- \Rightarrow Insulation of duct work above the dome
- ⇒ New entry doors on both entrances of the education building
- ⇒ New flooring in the Fellowship Hall Bathrooms and lower level landings
- \Rightarrow New coating on education building entryways.
- ⇒ New stair treads on both staircases of the education building, from the lower level to the 2nd floor.
- ⇒ Kitchen renovation currently in process


